MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE
ON
REGULATORY REFORM

Wednesday, September 26, 2018 10:30 a.m. Room 519 House Office Building

The House Standing Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by the Chair.

Members present: Reps. Iden, Bellino, Kesto, Crawford, Theis, Webber, Griffin, Hauck, Hoytenga, Reilly, Moss, Dianda, Chirkun, Liberati, Love, Jones.

Absent/Excused: None.

Representative Moss moved to adopt the minutes of September 5th, 2018. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid HB 6086 before the committee:

HB 6086 (Vaupel) Liquor; other; use, possession, and sale of marijuana-infused alcohol; prohibit.

Chairman Iden offered the following amendment to House Bill 6086:

1. Amend page 1, line 6, after "**BEVERAGE**" by striking out the balance of the line the line through "**BEER,**" on line 7 and inserting "**OF ANY TYPE**".

Chairman Iden spoke to his amendment.

Representative Bellino moved to adopt the amendment to House Bill 6086. The motion prevailed 16-0-0.

Juline Lloyd, representing the Michigan Coalition for Fetal Alcohol Research, Education, and Support, submitted a card in support of the bill but did not wish to speak.

Kerry Krone and Julie Wendt, representing the Michigan Liquor Control Commission, submitted a card indicating that the commission has no position on the bill and did not wish to speak.

Representative Kesto moved to report House Bill 6086 with recommendation as amended as substitute (H-1). The motion prevailed 14-2-0.

The Chair laid SB 751 before the committee:

SB 751 (Knollenberg) Occupations; cosmetologists; shampoo services performed in a cosmetology establishment by certain students; allow.

Representative Hauck moved to report House Bill 6086 with recommendation. The motion prevailed 15-0-1.

The Chair laid HB 6110, HB 6111, HB 6112, HB 6113, and HB 6381 before the committee:

HB 6110 (Iden) Occupations; individual licensing and regulation; use of criminal record to determine eligibility for occupational licensing; restrict.

HB 6111 (Griffin) Health occupations; other; eligibility requirements for certain licenses and registrations under the public health code; revise.

HB 6112 (Hoitenga) Occupations; other; eligibility requirements for certain licenses and regulations under the skilled trades regulation act; revise.

HB 6113 (Bellino) Occupations; other; eligibility requirements for certain licenses and regulations under the occupational code; revise.

HB 6381 (Moss) Occupations; individual licensing and regulation; annual report on issuance or denial of licensure based on lack of good moral character; require.

Chairman Iden testified in support of the bills.

Representative Moss testified in support of the bills.

Jarrett Skorup, representing the Mackinac Center for Public Policy, and Kimberly Buddin, representing the American Civil Liberties Union, testified in support of the bills following a video presentation in support of the bills. They were joined by Gary Wozniak, representing Recovery Park, in testifying in support of the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

The Chair laid HB 6114 before the committee:

HB 6114 (Theis) Occupations; other; review of occupational regulations by Michigan law revision commission; require.

Representative Theis testified in support of her bill.

Lee McGrath, representing the Institute for Justice, testified in support of the bill. Questions and discussion followed.

Taylor Benavente and Cheryl Ronk, representing the Michigan Society of Association Executives, testified with concerns regarding the bill but indicated the association is neutral on the bill. Questions and discussion followed.

The chair returned to House Bill 6110, HB 6111, HB 6112, HB 6113, and HB 6381 and continued on with HB 6114.

Ron Brenke, representing the American Council of Engineering Companies, and Leanne Panduren, representing the Michigan Society of Professional Engineers, testified in opposition to House Bills 6110, 6111, 6112, 6113, and 6114. Questions and discussion followed.

The following people submitted a card in opposition to House Bill 6110, but did not wish to speak:

Tom Clement, representing the State Court Administrative Office and the Board of Law Examiners.

Becky Gean, representing the Michigan Realtors, submitted a card and did not wish to speak in opposition to House Bills 6110 and 6114, but is working with sponsors to address their concerns.

Brett Dodge, representing the Michigan Society of Professional Surveyors, submitted a card indicating that the society is neutral on House Bills 6110 and 6114, but did not wish to speak.

The following people submitted a card in support of House Bills 6110 and 6113, but did not wish to speak:

Alexa Kramer, representing the Grand Rapids Chamber.

Peter Ruark, representing the Michigan League for Public Policy, submitted a card in support of House Bills 6110, 6111, 6112, and 6113 but did not wish to speak.

Pete Lund, representing Americans for Prosperity, submitted a card in support of House Bills 6110, 6111, 6112, 6113, and 6114 but did not wish to speak.

Stephen Smith, representing ALA Michigan, submitted a card in opposition to House Bill 6114 with concerns about the bill's language, but did not wish to speak.

The Chair laid HB 5881 before the committee:

HB 5881 (Iden) Gaming; casinos; general amendments to the Michigan gaming control and revenue act; provide for.

Chairman Iden testified in support of his bill.

Bruce Dall, representing the Motor City Casino, and Michael Neubecker, representing the MGM Grand Detroit, testified in support of the bill. Questions and discussion followed.

Dave Murley, representing the Michigan Gaming Control Board, submitted a card indicating the board has no position on the bill, but did not wish to speak.

Representative Bellino offered congratulations to Representative Crawford on celebrating her 54th wedding anniversary.

There being no further business before the committee, the Chair adjourned the meeting at 11:48 a.m.
