The House Standing Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by the Chair.

The Chair laid SB 1207 before the committee:

SB 1207 (Horn) Construction; code; limit on cost of required accessibility route to an area of primary function when making alterations to an existing building; allow for.

Senator Horn and Wayne Jewell, representing the Building Owners and Managers Association, testified in support of the bill.

Lee Schwartz, representing the Michigan Home Builders, submitted a card in support of the bill, but did not wish to speak.

The Chair laid SB 1185 before the committee:

SB 1185 (Robertson) Occupations; electricians; municipal licensure as a condition to apprenticeship or training; prohibit.

Keith Ledbetter, representing the Southeast Michigan Construction Academy, testified in support of the bill.

Todd Tennis, representing the IBEW Michigan State Conference, testified about the current statute the bill would amend and indicated the IBEW is neutral on the bill.

SB 1094 (Stamas) Liquor; licenses; issuance of a national sporting event license; expand to include Ladies Professional Golf Association Tour Champions Tournament for certain calendar years.

Kayla North, Legislative Aide for Senator Stamas, testified in support of the bill. Questions and discussion followed.

Julie Wendt, representing the Michigan Liquor Control Commission, submitted a card indicating the commission has no position on the bill and did not wish to speak.

The Chair laid HB 6498 before the committee:

HB 6498 (Iden) Trade; vehicles; regulation of motor vehicle manufacturers and dealers and requirements for dealer agreements; revise.

Kurt Berryman, representing the Auto Dealers of Michigan, testified in support of the proposed substitute (H-1). Questions and discussion followed.

Karen Johnston, representing Toyota, submitted a card indicating Toyota is neutral on the proposed substitute (H-1) to HB 6498, and did not wish to speak.

Representative Webber spoke to his amendment.

Representative Webber moved to adopt the amendment to Senate Bill 1219. The motion prevailed 16-0-0.
