HB 4839 (VanderWall)      Vehicles; registration; authority to deny or suspend vehicle registrations of carriers under certain circumstances; provide for.

HB 4881 (Lucido) Traffic control; violations; definition of clearly visible registration plate; clarify.

Representative Lucido addressed the Committee regarding the contents of HB 4881.

Dave Richmond, representing the Michigan Secretary of State (MSOS) submitted a card indicating a neutral position on the bill.

The Chair laid the following bill before the Committee.

HB 4705 (Lucido) Vehicles; driver training; training component for drivers regarding protocol when pulled over by a law enforcement officer; include in curriculum.

Representative Lucido reviewed the contents of the bill with the Committee.

Dave Richmond, representing the MSOS, submitted a card indicating a neutral position on the bill.

There being no additional business before the Committee, Chair Cole declared the meeting adjourned, the time being 11:33 a.m.
