Context of the Plan

- · Roughly 900 Children in Care
 - 400-500 in Foster Care
 - 70-80 in Residential Setting
 - Remainder in In-Home Care
- DHS Child Care Fund averages over \$11 Million
- 85% 90% of Cases are Managed by Private Agencies

Project Scope

The department, in conjunction with court and county personnel and representatives of the private child welfare agencies operating in Kent County, shall conduct a work group that will identify a plan for implementing a pilot program to privatize all foster care and adoption services, except for child protective services, in Kent County by September 30, 2013.

Project Guiding Principles

- Sustain a youth and family focus
- Ensure the safety of all stakeholders
- · Provide the right care at the right time
- Respect the roles of all participants within the system
- Implement funding models that best ensure affordable levels of care
- Embed transparency
- Use collaborative, evidence-based, continuallyimproving models
- 'No rejections; No ejections'

Project Goals

- Provide better outcomes for youth
- Increase the use of community support systems
- Embed local points of control for serving local needs without compromising the integrity of system wide principles
- Transform our focus from a process orientation to a service orientation

Current System Gaps

- Direct DHS management of children in care & foster homes.
- Contractual language that does not permit a single agency case manager for certain placements.
- A lengthy administrative approval process for necessary assessments and flexible treatment choices.
- A need to provide earlier entry points to the system that would increase the chances of family preservation.
- A need to develop and/or expand specialized care settings.
- Complexity of reimbursements using multiple funding sources.
