
Who We Are



FY20 Revenue by Source




Michigan AgrAbility

Michigan AgrAbility is a partnership between Easterseals Michigan and Michigan State University Extension.

We serve 70 new individuals per year with funding from agriculture industry donors, USDA, and MRS.

150+ farmers are served annually as we regularly follow up with past clients to ensure their success.





Doug VerHoeven - Holland, Michigan

Doug VerHoeven was paralyzed at age 17 when the farm truck he was driving was struck by another vehicle.

He farms corn and soybeans and helps his neighbor farmers at Brink Farms.





AgrAbility and Michigan Rehabilitation Services

After 40 years of pushing a manual wheelchair and pulling himself into tractors, Doug's shoulders were wearing out.

With guidance from AgrAbility, he obtained funding for a manlift trailer through Michigan Rehabilitation Services. He can use this to raise up into his own equipment and his neighbor's.





AgrAbility Demonstration Farm

Doug has many years experience working the farm with his disability. He has adapted in many ways, and with the help of AgrAbility received necessary assistive technology to maintain his employment on the farm.

Doug and AgrAbility give demonstration tours at his farm for other people with disabilities to learn how to work.

Our AgrAbility program, a USDA funded non-profit partnership with Michigan State University Extension programs (MSUE), meets the special needs of **farmers with disabilities**. We help farmers with any kind of disability or medical impairment determine ways to keep doing their work.

Easterseals is developing specialized services to address their growing behavioral health care needs through a proposed two-year project in partnership with MSUE.

- It will serve 75 farmers during its first year (given startup) and 150 farmers the second year.
- It will meet the complex care needs of farmers and their families to optimize their wellness.
- The collaborative care program will treat the whole person, including physical/behavioral health and contributing social determinants of health challenges.
