Target Population

Court ordered male and female probationers ages 16-39 identified as moderate to high-risk of becoming repeat offenders

Personal Barriers

30 -35 % of male participants and 70 % of female participants suffer from emotional or mental health issues

Education Recovery

73%

Of SCSF probationers are functionally illiterate.

SCSF provides a remedial education component including:

- Reading and Math modules
- One on one tutorial sessions
- Helped 175 enrollees increase literacy



Job Placement Rate

72%

185 participants were placed in competitive positions out of 258 probationers served

100% of program completers were placed in a competitive position



Job Retention

83%

The skills gained through SCSF help individuals maintain employment beyond 30 days

Less than 35% of male participants that come through the program have been previously employed


112 participants achieved 30 day retention out of 136 participants placed at jobs



FLIP THE SCRIPT EDUCATION RECOVERY



Assumptions Regardless of grade level "every" participant needs/required to review basic skills and undergo regular intervals of testing to chart progress of skill development and/or improvement. A vast majority of participants function well in our setting however have major struggles in their home environment and lack support and encouragement.

External Factors Attendance, most participants are severely distracted by life and survival issues (enough food, proper clothing, housing/homelessness, employment, childcare issue and domestic relationship issues). Many males lives with women that are the essential provider in the household which is the cause of emotional struggles/conflict.
