






2018 State of Michigan Budget






2018 DEQ Budget by Fund Source






2018 DEQ Budget by Category



Oil & Gas Program

- Oversees 21,000 Oil & Gas Wells Across the State
- Revenue Decline Due to Low Oil & Gas Prices
- \$4 Million of On-Going General Funds





Air Quality Program

- Regulate Air Pollutants to Reduce Impact to Health & Environment
- Partially Funded by Hazardous Waste Fees
- \$1.3 Million of On-Going General Funds for Air Quality





Ensuring Quality Drinking Water

- **Drinking Water Revolving Funds Match**
- Drinking Water Emergency
- Drinking Water Program
- **Manufactured Housing Communities**



Drinking Water Revolving Funds Match

- Provides Low-Interest Loans to Infrastructure Upgrades **Local Communities for**
- \$5 Million \$2.95 Million of Additional On-Going General Funds for a Total
- \$25 Million of Federal Funds Leveraged
- \$60 Million in Annual Loans





Drinking Water Emergency

- \$1 Million of One-Time General Funds for FY18
- Provide Expertise in Operations, Management, **Training**
- \$100 Million of One-Time Federal Funds in Fiscal Year 2017 Supplemental
- Support Water Infrastructure Improvements





Drinking Water Program

- **Expand Flint Technical Assistance Efforts Statewide**
- Water Supplies Outreach to 1,400 Community
- \$2.6 Million of On-Going General Funds





Manufactured Housing Communities

- Evaluate Drinking Water & Waste Water Systems to Protect Public Health
- Inspect 800 Additional Manufactured Housing Communities
- \$500,000 of On-Going General Funds
