

Public Water Supplies

- Community Water Supplies
 - 1,400 Supplies Provide Water for 25 or More Residents Year Round
 - Municipalities, Apartments, Nursing Homes, Etc.
- Non-Community Supplies
 - 10,000 Supplies Provide Water to 25 or More Individuals at Least 60 Days per Year
 - · Schools, Restaurants, Motels, Churches, Daycares, Etc.







Well Drilling

- 1.2 Million Households Served by Private Wells
- 13,000 Drilled Each Year
- Program Regulates Well Construction, Audits Local Health Departments, Provides Training & Consultation







Public Swimming Pools

- Oversee Permitting Program for Public Pools
- 6,000 Pools Regulated
- Local Health Departments Conduct Inspections
- Includes Schools, Hotels, Apartment Buildings, Health Clubs







Campgrounds

- License Required to Operate Campground
- 1,400 Campgrounds Regulated
- Local Health Departments Conduct Inspections
- Includes Temporary Campgrounds, Small 5 Sites Campgrounds, Large 500+ Sites Campgrounds







Septage Waste

- Septage Waste Recycled Into Fertilizer for Agriculture
- Septage Waste Vehicles are Licensed
- Site Permits are Required
- Local Health Departments Assist with Inspections







On Site Wastewater

- Treatment of Human Waste at Location Generated
- Staff Review New Plans, Audit Local Health Departments, Administer Regulations, Provide Training & Consultation

- Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program
- Clean Water Revolving Loan Program
- Bond Programs











Bond Programs

- Stormwater, Asset Management, and Wastewater Grants and Loans, \$97 Million in FY17
- 344 Grants/Loans Valued at \$291 Million, To Date
