1. DEQ presentation: Clean Michigan Initiative (CMI) Bonds, Brownfield Development, and Vapor Intrusion

Sue Leeming, Remediation & Redevelopment Division chief, DEQ Amy Epkey, Deputy Director, DEQ

Sue Leeming and Amy Epkey gave a presentation on DEQ's CMI CMI bonds, brownfield projects, and vapor intrusion efforts. Highlights of the presentation included:

- Introduction to contaminated sites
 - o About 50% of sites have a responsible party
 - o About 50% of sites are orphaned
- Types of contaminated sites
 - o Part 213 sites petroleum related (8,000)
 - o Part 201 sites non-petroleum related (7,000)
 - o Superfund sites (65)
- Remediation & redevelopment Division's role
- Who pays for cleanups
 - o Liable parties
 - o Refined petroleum fund (RPF, orphan sites)
 - Bonds cover orphan sites (non-petroleum)
 - Superfund sites = federal + 10% state match (CMI)
- Average cleanups
- CMI bond
 - Subfund allocations
- Brownfield and cleanup subfund details
- CMI accomplishments

- Unfunded high priority sites
