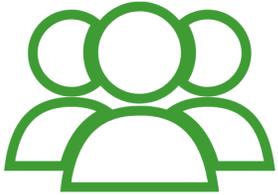

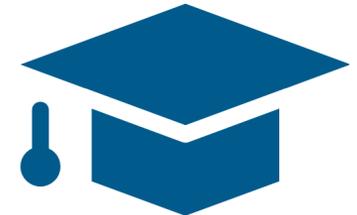

DTMB 2021: A Year in Review

DTMB received Silver Certification status as a veteran-friendly employer by the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency.



The Cybersecurity team launched Michigan Secure, a free mobile application, to protect Michigan residents from cybercriminals while using their phones and other mobile devices.



DTMB issued \$28M in grants to extend broadband access to over 22,200 households, businesses, and community organizations in unserved areas in Michigan.

We hired Michigan's first digital information accessibility coordinator to make state government websites and applications more accessible to all Michiganders.



DTMB 2021: A Year in Review

The department hired its first full-time equity and inclusion officer as part of its commitment to providing an equitable organizational culture.



The Michigan Public Safety Communication System added 35 towers across 11 counties, improving the access Michigan public safety professionals have to life-saving communication.



The Logistics and Operations Support division raised nearly \$5M selling surplus items through online auctions.

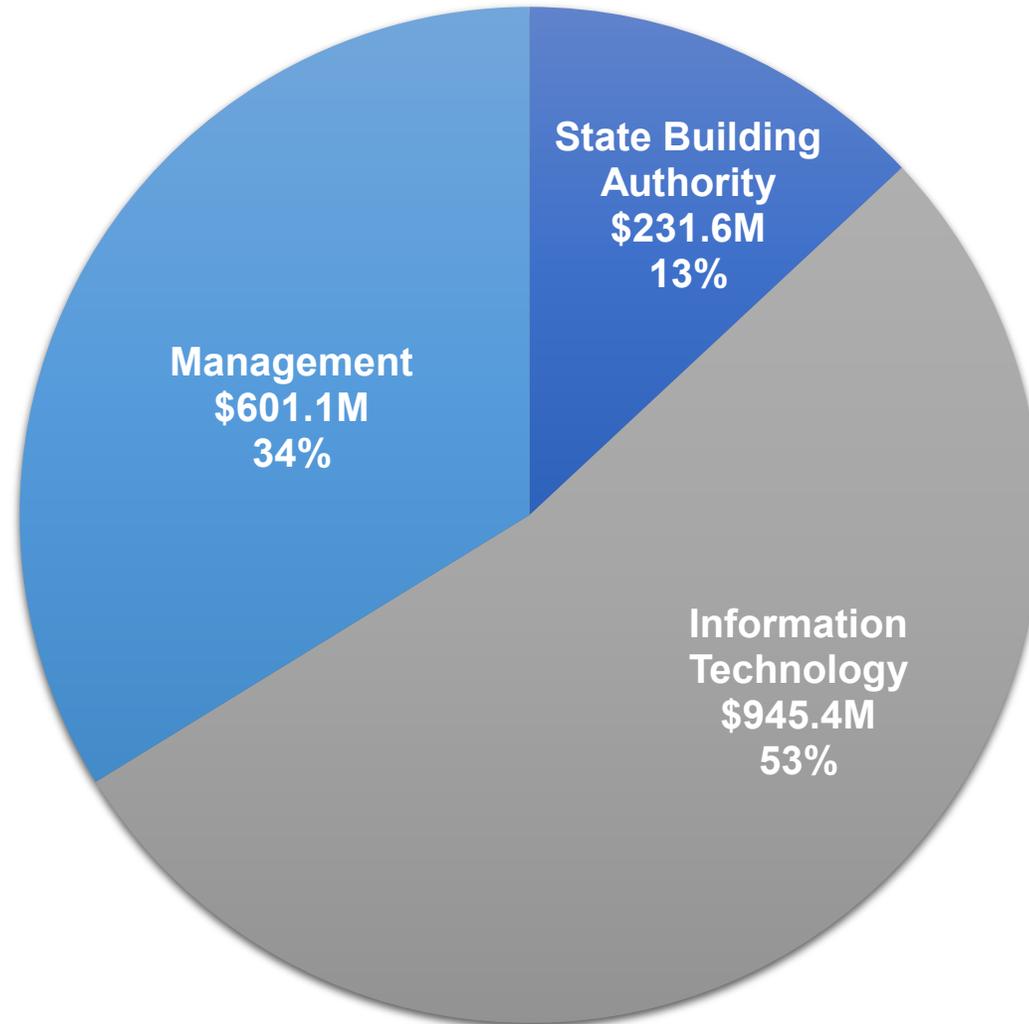

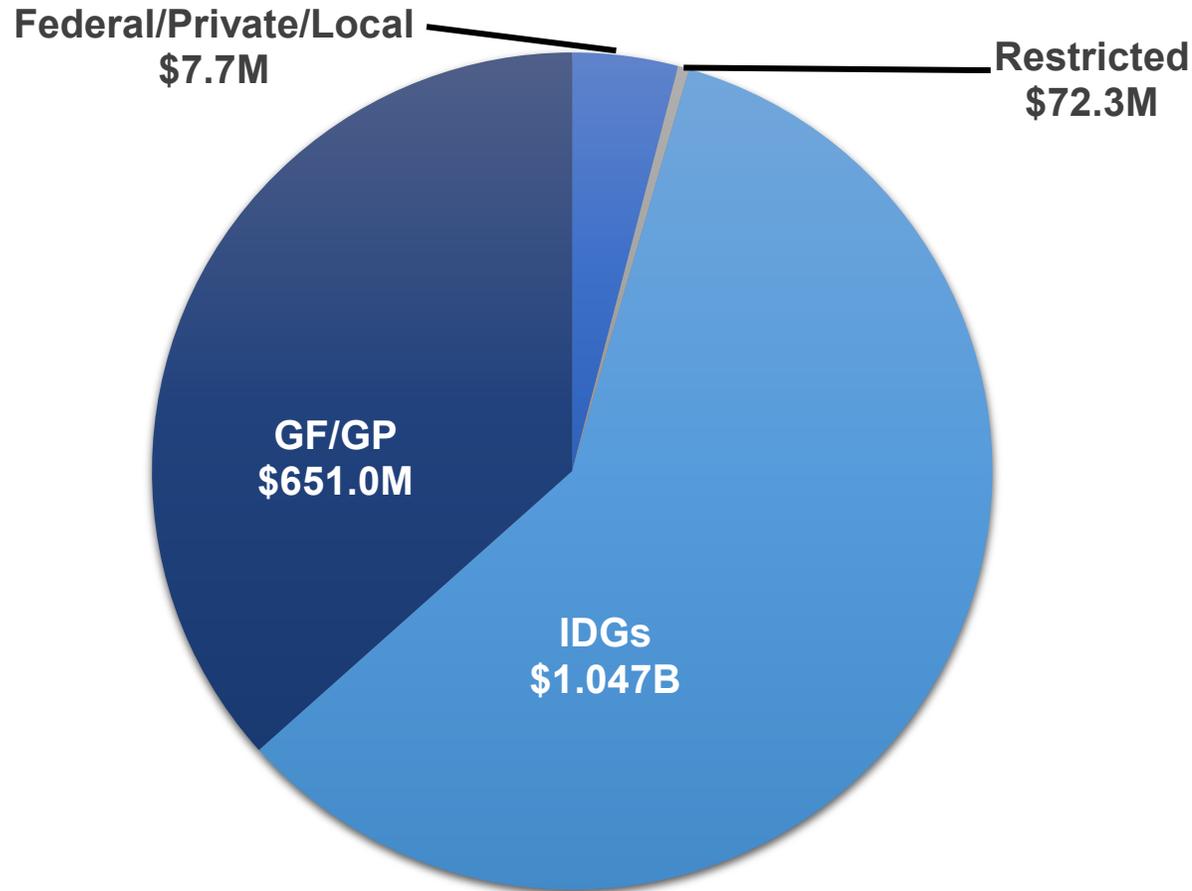

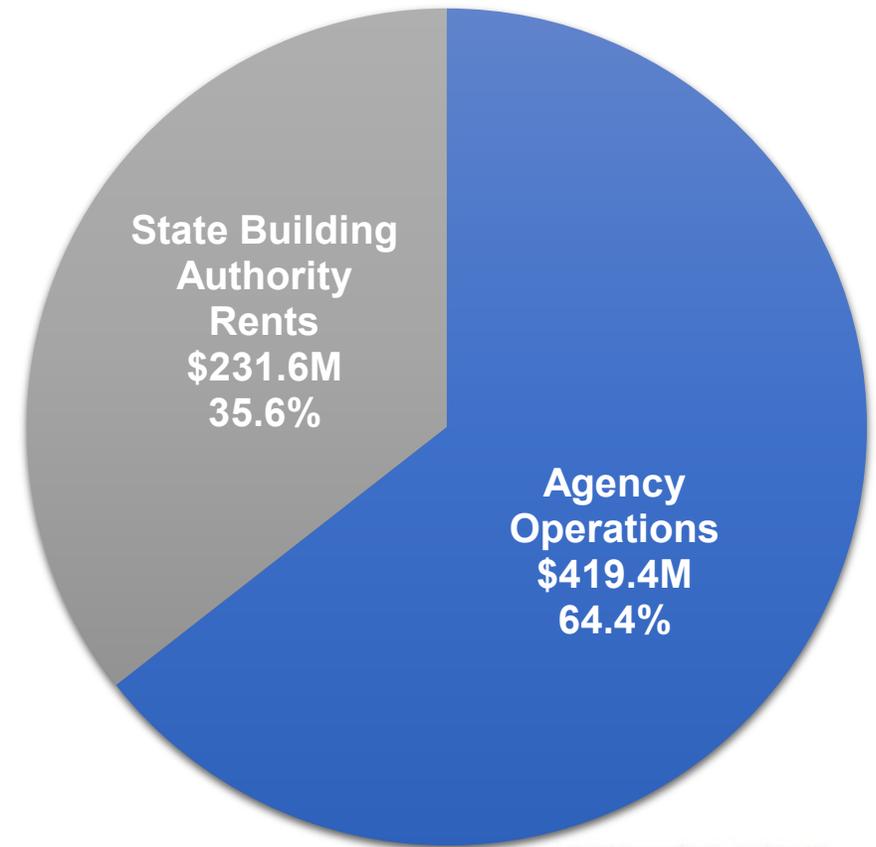


DTMB FY 2023 Funding Breakdown

Fund Sourcing by Source FY 2023



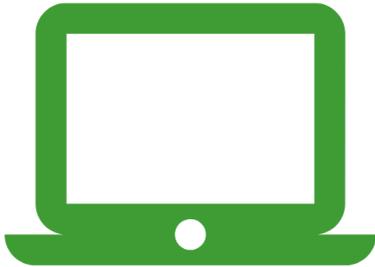

- Government operations are a growing target
- **\$6T** – average annual global cost of cybercrime
- **\$4.24M** – average data breach cost in 2021
 - Up 10% from 2020
 - Hidden costs, such as customer loss, revenue loss, or remedy solutions not included
- **37% of global organizations** claimed ransomware attack in 2021 – most significant in U.S. were:
 - Oil pipeline – Colonial Pipeline
 - Water treatment plant – Florida
 - Meat-packing facilities – JBS
 - Public transit system – New York subway
 - Major payroll system – Kronos
 - IT security monitoring tools – Solar Winds/Microsoft Exchange
 - Does not include the healthcare systems, schools, local governments, businesses, and individuals attacked

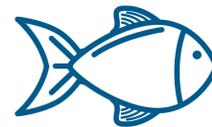

- Staff augmentation in three critical areas
 - Governance, Risk and Compliance Program – 9.0 FTEs
 - Perform critical security accreditation and risk assessments of all IT systems across the enterprise.
 - Security Operations – 8.0 FTEs
 - The front-line program for monitoring critical IT systems for threats.
 - Security Architecture – 2.0 FTEs
 - Ensuring legacy system replacements or upgrades are designed with adequate security protocols.

 - Replace exhausted one-time or project funds with permanent source

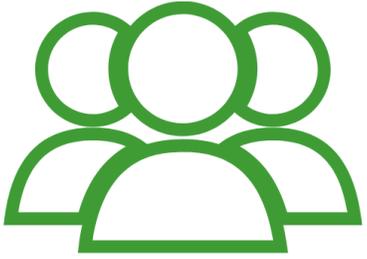


Longitudinal Data Analytics Service Center \$2M GF/GP



- Continuation of FY 2022 investment
- Creation of a central data center for analytics, research, and information sharing between state agencies
- Funding will support the build, on-going staffing, and operation of the center

Procurement and Financial Services

- \$1.3M and 9.0 FTEs
- \$872,100 restricted and \$473,300 GF/GP
- Support for more complex IT contracts



State building usage optimization

- \$1.0M GF/GP
- One-time work project to support multi-year project

- \$115M GF/GP one-time
- Combined total of \$150M in funding to support agency legacy system replacement projects

- Second year deposit to support smaller projects in state-owned facilities



Michigan Infrastructure Office

- \$5M GF/GP and 5.0 FTEs
- New office to coordinate federal infrastructure funding

Department	Project Description	Amount
Civil Rights	Civil Rights Information System (CRIS) Enhancements: Provides for enhancements such as new COVID complaint categories, automated calculation of damages, invoice and receipt processing, and records retention and disposal.	\$300,000
MDHHS	Vital Statistics Migration to Vital Event Registration Application (VERA): Enhance existing VERA system by adding electronic death, marriage, and divorce records, thus integrating them with birth records and the enterprise Master Person Index.	\$3.5M
LEO	Unemployment Insurance System Replacement: Provides for the replacement of the Unemployment Insurance Agency's Michigan Integrated Data Automated System (MiDAS) and other related systems that support the collection of unemployment taxes from employers and payments of unemployment insurance benefits to eligible claimants.	\$75M
LARA	Bureau of Construction Codes Licensing, Inspection and Public Portal Upgrades: Consolidates multiple licensing applications into one solution providing new management tools, including licensing workflow, billing functions, and a public portal for licensees.	\$3M
LARA	Bureau of Fire Services (BFS) Storage Tanks Registration and Regulation IT Upgrade: Upgrades to existing system providing inventory and regulatory support for above ground and underground storage tank programs by adding GIS functionality, dashboard metrics, ad-hoc reporting capabilities, and improving the public access portal.	\$1.054M
LARA	Bureau of Financial and Administrative Services (FAS) Central Cashiering Modernization: Modernization of central cashiering applications will no longer be supported in 2025. Improvements include faster transaction processing, archiving capabilities, automated SIGMA integrations and various internal bureau application interfaces with associated metric dashboards to monitor processing times.	\$2.375M
DTMB enterprise	Contact Center Technology Upgrade: Migrate two large call centers (Treasury, 1,900-5,000 per day & Civil Service, 800 per day) currently on end-life technology to Federal Risk and Authorization Management Program (FedRAMP) cloud platforms offering enhanced predictive analytics and security protections that meet federal standards.	\$8.9M

DTMB enterprise	MILogin Security Enhancements: Includes fraud analytics using AI models to prevent bot access and develop user- based risk scoring, adds multi-factor authentication for external users, extends fraud analytics to agency applications, adds various ID verification tools to reduce duplication, and adds capabilities with elastic architecture to scale on demand to user services.	\$27.050M

The ITIF recommendation includes \$2M allocated off-the-top for cybersecurity and \$2.775M reserved for project quality assurance.
