



# Gaming in Michigan

## Responsible Gaming

- Operators spend approximately **\$500 million** annually on internet gaming, internet sports betting, and fantasy contests advertising to compel people to gamble.
- MGCB received an ongoing appropriation for \$3 million effective FY2024 for advertising for responsible gaming.
- MGCB has contracted with King Media for a statewide advertising campaign.

# Fiscal Year 2025

## Executive Recommendation

- **No General Fund money or Detroit, land-based casino tax money is used to fund MGCB's appropriations.**
- **Union representation for 33 staff: UAW, SEIU, MSEA.**
- **Details for the increases are provided on the following slides.**
- **MGCB is also coordinating with DHHS to increase funding to the Compulsive Gaming Prevention Fund from the Internet Gaming and Internet Sports Betting Funds.**
  - **In FY2024, the combined contribution from these funds is \$1 million.**
  - **A proposal has been submitted to increase the combined contribution to \$4 million starting in FY2025.**

# Fiscal Year 2025

## Budget Request - Proposals for Change

### **Additional Positions Needed to Support New Gaming Programs**

\$1.9 million, 14 FTEs

- Internet gaming, internet sports betting, and fantasy contest continue to produce a significant increase in workload well beyond original projections.
- Live dealer expansion
  - Third provider licensed in late, 2023
- The volume of participant's self excluding from legalized gaming activities continues to rise.
- The requested positions will provide needed support for the following areas:
  - Auditing and regulatory efforts of internet gaming/internet sports betting operators.
  - Processing of increased game submissions and reviews/audits of IT technology used to deliver internet gaming.
  - Licensing and investigation support for determining suitability and issuing licenses.
  - Investigating/responding to more participant complaints received.
  - Providing information and resources on responsible gaming, attending community outreach events, and assistance with the "Don't Regret The Bet" program.
  - Processing applications of placements/removals for the Disassociated Persons List (DPL) and the Responsible Gaming Database.
  - Criminal investigations of illegal gaming sites and increased reports of illegal gambling machines.
