I would like to know of how much funding will be going to the PIHPs and I also would like to talk on the budget from last Fiscal Year. My son and every autistic child with the Child Waiver in Wayne County are being denied services that The PIHP gets prepaid to provide. Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network does not have contracts in place to provide behavioral therapies that the PHIP gets prepaid to provide. Not having the contracts in place defaults every autistic child on the Child Waiver to be denied services because they are not receiving the services.

In your packets I provided the Enrolled House Bill No. 5396 Budget for The Department of Health and Human Services for September 2020 - 2021. This report shows that each PIHP received \$1,673,960,400.00. The next report is the Medicaid Managed Mental Health Care Program Report 12. This report shows per capita, meaning what was paid out to the Medicaid Recipients. The total payout from Detroit Wayne was \$1,482,938,831.00. That leaves a remainder of \$191,021,569.00 in State funding. Where is the remainder of this funding going?

Unfortunately, not to the recipients that very much need this funding for services that they are already approved for.

• You will also find in the packet, emails that proves that the PIHP and Provider do not have any contracts in place for the 12 services that I have requested that is covered under the Child Waiver Program starting January 20, 2022. The PIHP and Provider are denying me written notice of denials, so I am not able to appeal them to the State. I did initiate a constructive appeal from the denials that I have received in emails. I submitted that appeal on March 7, 2022 and have not heard anything back by the PIHP on if they will deny the appeal.

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Lastly, you will find a proposed House Bill No. 4926. From my understanding, everyone here is in favor of this Bill. This Bill proposes to break contract with the PIHPs and to restructure a new organization and name it The Department of Specialty Services. It states that, "The Department of Specialty Services and supports provided under this subsection shall be carved out from the basic Medicaid health care benefits package. Does this

mean the Child waiver and other specialty waivers would be eliminated? If so, how is this bill any better than what is in process now? My son will still not get the services that he needs.

Why are we allowing the government to handle Mental Health? Why isn't Mental Health being Provided by Private insurance companies like Dental and Health. Mental Health is Health. Why are we creating barriers by adding middlemen?

For 14 months I had to drive 4 hours a day to take my son to a quality ABA center. I'm currently driving 4 hours a week to take him to a Speech and Occupational Center that specializes in Autistic Children. We don't have quality facilities where I live. My son was denied by aba centers close to home because we have BCBS for primary through my husband's work. They would not accept my son with the Child Waiver. The system is broken. My son and every other autistic child with the Child Waiver are being failed.

I am asking for the House of Representatives to represent the Autistic Children in my County. It is crucial from the ages 18 months to 5 years of age to must have early intervention and intensive behavioral therapies to have a fighting chance to live as normal as possible in society with this disability. What are you going to do to help us?

(2) Upon sale of bonds or notes for the projects identified in part 1 or for equipment as authorized by a legislative appropriation act and in this section, the state building authority shall credit the general fund of the state an amount equal to that expended from the general fund plus interest, if any, as defined in this section.

(3) For state building authority projects for which bonds or notes have been issued and upon the request of the state building authority, the state treasurer shall make advances without interest from the general fund as necessary to meet cash flow requirements for the projects, which advances shall be reimbursed by the state building authority when the investments earmarked for the financing of the projects mature.

(4) In the event that a project identified in part 1 is terminated after final design is complete, advances made on behalf of the state building authority for the costs of final design shall be repaid to the general fund in a manner

recommended by the director.

Sec. 1102. (1) State building authority funding to finance construction or renovation of a facility that collects revenue in excess of money required for the operation of that facility shall not be released to a university or community college unless the institution agrees to reimburse that excess revenue to the state building authority. The excess revenue shall be credited to the general fund to offset rent obligations associated with the retirement of bonds issued for that facility. The auditor general shall annually identify and present an audit of those facilities that are subject to this section. Costs associated with the administration of the audit shall be charged against money recovered pursuant to this section.

(2) As used in this section, "revenue" includes state appropriations, facility opening money, other state aid,

indirect cost reimbursement, and other revenue generated by the activities of the facility.

Sec. 1103. The state building authority shall provide to the JCOS, senate and house fiscal agencies, and state budget director a report relative to the status of construction projects associated with state building authority bonds as of September 30 of each year, on or before October 15, or not more than 30 days after a refinancing or restructuring bond issue is sold. The report shall include, but is not limited to, the following:

(a) A list of all completed construction projects for which state building authority bonds have been sold, and

which bonds are currently active.

(b) A list of all projects under construction for which sale of state building authority bonds is pending.

(c) A list of all projects authorized for construction or identified in an appropriations act for which approval of schematic/preliminary plans or total authorized cost is pending that have state building authority bonds identified as a source of financing.

I want a notice of denial for the following services, Family Training, NON Family Training, Music Therapy, Art Therapy, Massage Therapy, Enhanced Transportation. If you are denying my written letter of denial, I want you to forward me to the recipient rights officer.

I will further continue advocating for my child at the state level.

I am not denying anything, just trying to figure out a way to get you the services. DWIHN does not have anyone contracted through them for those services. But an agency or person can always try to contract through DWIHN. I did find another way I did not know about at first and that is through self-determination. Since you are already going through PAS, you would continue to go through them for the services, but it is a process. This is what DWIHN in self-determination sent me.

All service providers must meet Medicaid requirements to provide services. The agency would need to go through DWIHN credentialing department, have certain licenses, insurances, and agree to standardized rates. A start would be giving me the name and number of the providers and I will begin the coordination with our Credentialing Department.

They sent the same thing to PAS, so they have an idea what is going on.

I can add all of it in the IPOS to show they are things you would like. If any of them do get denied, then you will get the option to appeal.

If you can give me some of the reasons why or goals that you would like for him to achieve with those services, I can add that onto the IPOS with the added hours for the CLS and respite. I will also add the fence to the IPOS, the process is the same as the bed.

Also, when we talked it sounded like you did not want enhanced transportation? If you do want it, then let me know and I will add that too.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:
