## WHAT FRAUD LOOKS LIKE

Most providers who commit Medicaid fraud fall into one or more of the

- Billing for patients who did not really receive services
- Billing for nonexistent patients or patients of other providers
- Billing for a service and/or equipment that wasn't provided.
- Billing for items and services that the patient no longer needs
- Overcharging for equipment or services.
- Billing for lengthy counseling sessions when only short session
- Concealing ownership or associations in a related company.
- Paying or accepting a "kickback" in exchange for a referral for r
- Billing more than once for the same service.
- Billing for medical services that were actually provided by unlice
- Using false credentials such as diplomas, licenses or certification
- Ordering tests or prescriptions that the patient does not need.
