

**Crime victim grants administration services - 17.0 FTEs, \$3.1 million Gross (\$1.7 million restricted Crime Victim Rights Fund; \$1.4 million federal Crime Victim Assistance, Crime Victim Compensation, Crime Victim Assistance/Discretionary Grants).**

Funding supports FTEs, related costs, and contracts to manage crime victim service programs and grants, provide public awareness, outreach, and publications for crime victims, support Crime Victim Services Commission, and administer statewide automated Michigan Crime Victim Notification Network (MCVNN) using the VINE (Victim Information and Notification Everyday) application system. **In FY2024-25, \$1.4 million Gross has been spent.**

**Crime victim justice assistance grants - \$78.6 million federal Crime Victim Assistance, Crime Victim Assistance/Discretionary Grants, Preventive Health, and Health Services Block Grant)**

Funding supports grants to public and private non-profit agencies for direct services to crime victims including crisis counseling, personal and legal advocacy, therapy, shelter, and referral, with priority to victims of sexual assault, spousal abuse, child abuse, and underserved victims, such as survivors of homicide and drunk driving. **In FY2024-25, \$21.1 million has been spent.**

**Crime victim rights services grants – \$19.9 million Gross (\$16.8 million restricted Crime Victim Rights Fund; \$3.1 million federal Crime Victim Compensation funds)**

Funding for compensation as payor of last resort to crime victims who suffer bodily injury for medical expenses, counseling, burial assistance, and loss of earnings caused by the injury; reimbursement to health care providers for victim forensic exams related to sexual assault (SAFE Response); training for local prosecutors, law enforcement, sheriffs, courts, jails, and other agencies to notify, inform, consult, and protect victims of crime as required by statute, including victim advocate programs in county prosecutor offices; and the Crime Victim Notification Network connecting prosecutors' offices with jails to inform crime victims of perpetrator status changes and court dates. **In FY2024-25, \$6.9 million Gross has been spent.**

**Crime victim rights sustaining grants - \$30.0 million GF/GP**

Funding distributed consistent with the allocation formulas for federal and state restricted crime victim rights grants. Also includes funding for a sexual assault nurse examiners (SANE) program at McLaren Central Michigan. **In FY2024-25, \$12.8 million GF/GP has been spent.**
