Overview of UM-Flint

Founded in 1956 as Flint Senior College

Officially changed to University of Michigan-Flint in 1971

One of three campuses of the University of Michigan (Ann Arbor, Dearborn)

Governed by UM-Board of Regents



Independent Institution

6000 students in 6 schools/colleges

Diverse student population

Urban setting



<u>UM-Flint: A Regional Comprehensive University</u>

"The workshorses of higher education"

Anchor institution in downtown Flint

Serving greater Flint, Genesee County and 6 adjacent counties (Tuscola, Lapeer, Oakland, Livingston, Shiawassee, and Saginaw)

3rd lowest tuition among the 15 MI public universities

Draw 97% of our students from the State of MI - Remain in MI after graduation -

Steady decline in high school graduates

<u>UM-Flint: Student Wellness and Campus Safety</u>

Campus safety plays an integral role in student wellness, especially in the areas of physical, emotional, environmental, and social aspects of wellness

<u>Department of Public Safety @ UM-Flint</u>

Provides a safe and caring educational environment through:

- Emergency preparedness and response, including emergency alerts, safety training, and transportation support
- Active role on the Campus Assessment, Response and Evaluation (CARE) Team
- Prevention and response to sexual misconduct, domestic violence and substance abuse
- Assistance in reinforcing policies and procedures in support of campus safety
- Reducing barriers for students to seek help and assistance
- High campus visibility and relationship building among faculty, staff and students

DPS role in creating an environment that promotes campus safety and a sense of belonging contributes to our students' overall wellness



<u>UM-Flint: Department of Public Safety</u>

Brief Overview:

- Accredited (and re-accredited) by the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Accreditation
- Staffing consists of law enforcement officers, security officers, dispatchers, electronic security experts and support staff
- Provides police and public safety services to the campus and neighboring downtown Flint community, which includes:
 - Traditional Law Enforcement Services
 - investigating traffic accidents, resolving disputes, investigating stolen vehicles, etc.
 - Non-Traditional Services
 - Vehicle lockout services, battery jumps, community support, etc.
