Supporting Student Success

Enhanced support for high need students: We successfully launched a new initiative, Warrior 360, designed to support high need students. 95% of the pilot cohort have returned for their second semester, compared to 92% of the entire first-year cohort, and student engagement remains high.

Federal TRIO: Upward Bound, Veterans Upward Bound and McNair Scholars were all renewed last year for five more years. By the end of the grant cycle, we will have more than 60 years of TRIO programming on our campus (the oldest and largest in the state). We were also recently awarded the TRIO SSS grant to support students with disabilities -- which added another \$1.3M to our Federal TRIO allocation.

Adult Learners: Warrior Way Back (a debt forgiveness program for stop-outs) was recently expanded to forgive up to \$4,000 in debt for students who have been gone for more than two years. This initiative will anchor newly developed programming to meaningfully engage new and returning adult learners.



Wayne State: By the Numbers

- Wayne State is a partner with Michigan State University and University of Michigan in the University Research Corridor, which brings in 94% of Michigan's federal research dollars each year.
- Wayne State's economic impact is estimated at **\$2.5 billion** annually.
- A majority of all of Wayne State's alumni in professional fields (e.g., medical and law) remain in Michigan after graduation.
- Wayne State has ranked #1 in Michigan for Social Mobility for two consecutive years.






What is Financial Aid?

Funds to assist students and their families with the costs of education

- Grants and scholarships
- Student loans
- Work-study



Qualifying for federal student aid

- U.S. citizen/national or eligible noncitizen
- High school diploma or equivalent
- Eligible degree/certificate program in college/career school
- Student has valid Social Security number
- Satisfactory academic progress in college/career school

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Federal aid formula

- The FAFSA produces an EFC the index used to determine need
 - EFC is determined by a formula that considers information such as the student's and parents' income and assets, how many people are in the family household as reported on the FAFSA





Cost of attendance

- Estimates based on surveys and other resources
 - Tuition and fees
 - Books, supplies, transportation, personal, miscellaneous
 - Housing and meals
 - Loan fees
- Other expenses as documented







Financial need

Estimated cost of attendance

- <u>- minus the EFC</u>
- = Financial need

In 2024-25 the federal formula for determining the EFC will be replaced by a new formula and produce an SAI – Student Aid Index

Federal aid

The student must have a significant level of financial need in order to receive maximum grant awards

Estimator: StudentAid.gov/aidestimator Maximum amounts for the major programs for a dependent freshman in 2023-24:

- Federal Pell Grant: \$7,395
- Federal Work-Study: depends on funds available at school
- Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans: \$5,500 total
- Direct PLUS Loan (for parents): COA minus other aid received



Federal Direct Loan Limits

Federal student loans

- 4.99% Interest Rate
- 1.057% Loan Fee

Parent Loan

- 7.54% Interest Rate
- 4.228% Loan Fee

<u>Subsidized</u>

Must demonstrate "need"

Unsubsidized

"Need" is not a consideration

Combined annual loan limits

- \$5,500 first year
- \$6,500 second year
- \$7,500 each remaining year of undergraduate study

Combined aggregate loan limit

- \$31,000 for a dependent, undergraduate student
- \$57,500 for an independent, undergraduate student

Admissions merit scholarships

- Competitive awards based on students' admissions application
- A completed WSU admissions application must be received by December 1 for maximum award scholarship consideration
- Merit awards offered to the first-year students entering in the fall:
 - Warrior Award Up to \$6,000 per year for four years -- \$24,000
 - Gold Award Up to \$4,000 per year for four years -- \$16,000
 - Green Award Up to \$2,500 per year for four years -- \$10,000
 - Scholar Award Up to \$500 per year for four years -- \$2,000





Tuition assistance programs

Heart of Detroit Program

Ensure the full cost of in-state tuition and standard fees is covered

- We fill the gap between Federal, State awards, and other WSU aid, and the full cost of in-state tuition and standard fees
- Be admitted by March 1 to be considered
- File your FAFSA by March 1, school code: 002329
- Full-time enrollment required (12 credits or more each fall and winter semester)
