






#### **Drug Courts Improve Unemployment**








#### **Drug Court Recidivism After 2 Years**







#### **Drug Court Recidivism After 4 Years**













# Mental Health Court Recidivism After 2 and 4 Years














# Swift and Sure Sanctions Probation Program Outcomes

- Less than 6% of drug tests were positive
- 39% successful completion rate
- 36% less likely to reoffend compared to standard probationers
