





PROGRAM FOR HIGH-RISK PROBATIONERS SEES GROWTH


Fiscal year 2018 was another year of growth for Michigan's Swift and Sure Sanctions Probation Program (SSSPP). The number of programs and probationers in those programs has continued to increase every year since SSSPP started in FY 2012.

In FY 2018, Michigan had 25 such programs covering 28 counties. Those programs helped 1,236 of Michigan's highest-risk felony probationers gain employment and turn their lives around for the better.




REDUCTIONS IN CRIME, UNEMPLOYMENT

New Convictions Within 3 Years of Admission



Unemployment at Admission and Discharge



SSSPP graduates had an almost 90 percent reduction in unemployment—from 57 percent at program admission to 6 percent at program discharge. In addition, the SSSPP resulted in reduced crime. Graduates were about 25 percent less likely to be convicted of a new offense within three years of admission than standard probationers (32 percent versus 42 percent).
