Secondary Road Patrol (SRP) And Traffic Accident Prevention Program

History of Program

- The Secondary Road Patrol (SRP) and Traffic Accident Prevention Program was created by the legislature in 1978 under Public Act 416.
- SRP is a grant program which provides funds to Sheriff's Offices to facilitate patrol operations for county and local roads outside of cities or villages.

History of Program

- Under the program, Deputies must participate in traffic enforcement, emergency assistance, traffic crash prevention and investigation, as well as criminal law enforcement.
 - -As an example of the importance of the program, over 50% of all traffic crashes occur on county secondary roads.

Funding History

- 1978 (year enacted): SRP funding was 100 percent funded through the General Fund.
- 1991-92: SRP began transitioning from 100 percent General Fund support to partial General Fund support with additional traffic citation surcharges.
- 2002-03: SRP began to be solely funded by traffic citation surcharges.

Deputies Funded

- 1978: 287 Deputies
- 2014: 133.6 Deputies
- 2015: 133.48 Deputies
- 2016: 125.6 Deputies
- 2017: 121.3 Deputies

This is a 57.7% decrease in Deputies patrolling through the SRP program since it began.

Traffic Citations

- In 1991, traffic citations were mandated to include a \$5 surcharge to be deposited in the SRP fund.
- The surcharge was increased to \$10 in 2001.
 - -This \$10 is part of the overall surcharge of \$40 on traffic citations called the Justice System Assessment.

Dwindling Patrols and Funds

• SRP Deputy numbers continued to decline due to the reduction in funds which has the issuance of less traffic citations and the reliance solely on traffic surcharges.

Dwindling Patrols and Funds

- Reasons for decreases in traffic citations:
 - Less manpower available to participate in SRP and overall tickets written
 - Michigan lost 12% of its law enforcement officers between 2006 and 2016.
 - Need to respond to violent crimes in other areas on non-secondary roads
 - Community Policing approach (more warnings and more positive interaction)

Collection of Funds

- Across the state of Michigan, there have been some discrepancies in the collection of funds under the Justice System Assessment.
- It is unclear whether all SRP surcharges are being collected and assessed accurately by the courts and if these funds are being deposited into the fund for the program.

Potential Fixes – Short-Term

- One-Time Appropriation or Fixed Line Item in the Budget –
 - 2012: \$600,000
 - -2018: \$2,000,000
