For FY 25:

- **CASES:** The state has fully recovered from the pandemic, we expect caseloads to trend upwards from 23,562 to 26,800 in FY 24, a 13.7% increase.
- Cost per Case: We estimate that the costs per case will increase from the FY 25 budget, rising from \$1,412.42 in FY 24 to \$1,590 in FY 25, representing a 12.6% increase. However, there was a 15% rate increase for all children in the program. Therefore, if cost per case was 15% we would say it is holding steady with where it was in FY 24. Since it is lower than this, it means this is actually a case of costs decreasing somewhat.
- Overall, the FY 25 CREC proposal shows an increase of \$12.3 million over the enacted FY 25 budget. Essentially, the cases are increasing based on both recent policy revisions and a trend back to pre-2020 program levels.

For FY 26:

- CASES: We expect caseloads to trend upwards from 26,800 to 29,400 in FY 25, a 9.7% increase
- Cost per Case: We estimate that the cost per case will decrease slightly from \$1,590 in FY 25 to \$1,540 in FY 26, a decrease of -3.1%.
- Overall, the CREC proposal shows an increase of \$44.3 million from FY 25. Essentially, cases will increase based on both recent policy revisions and a trend back to pre-pandemic program levels while costs will slightly decrease.
