

MICHIGAN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ACT

Public Act 390 of 1976

Under the authority of the Michigan Emergency Management Act (Public Act 390 of 1976), the Michigan State Police, Emergency Management and Homeland Security Division (MSP/EMHSD), is responsible for providing an effective emergency management system for the State of Michigan.



ABOUT MSP/EMHSD

- Provide leadership and coordination.
- Manage EM and HS Grants
 - 25 = more than \$91 million
 - EMPG and HSGP
- HSGP = 80% to locals, 20% to the state
- EMHS Training Center




MITIGATION

- 66 FEMA Mitigation Grants
 - \$46,512,769
 - 25% cost share

- Planning, training, exercising.
- 2016

 - 589 local exercises
 - 27,032+ locals benefited
- MICIMS – 2,543 users


