I am the mother of Aaron (2nd), Micah (1st), and Matthew (Kindergarten), students at Detroit Prep, as well as one of the closest neighbors of the currently abandoned Anna Joyce Elementary School in Pingree Park. I am writing you to in support of Bill SB 702.

This Bill, which would allow Detroit Prep to purchase and restore the abandoned Anna Joyce Elementary School, would not only be something that my family and I would personally celebrate, but I am confident that my neighbors in Pingree Park and the surrounding neighborhoods would also. Buildings that were built and supported by taxpayer's money should continue to serve and be a positive light to our neighborhoods and used for public purposes.
