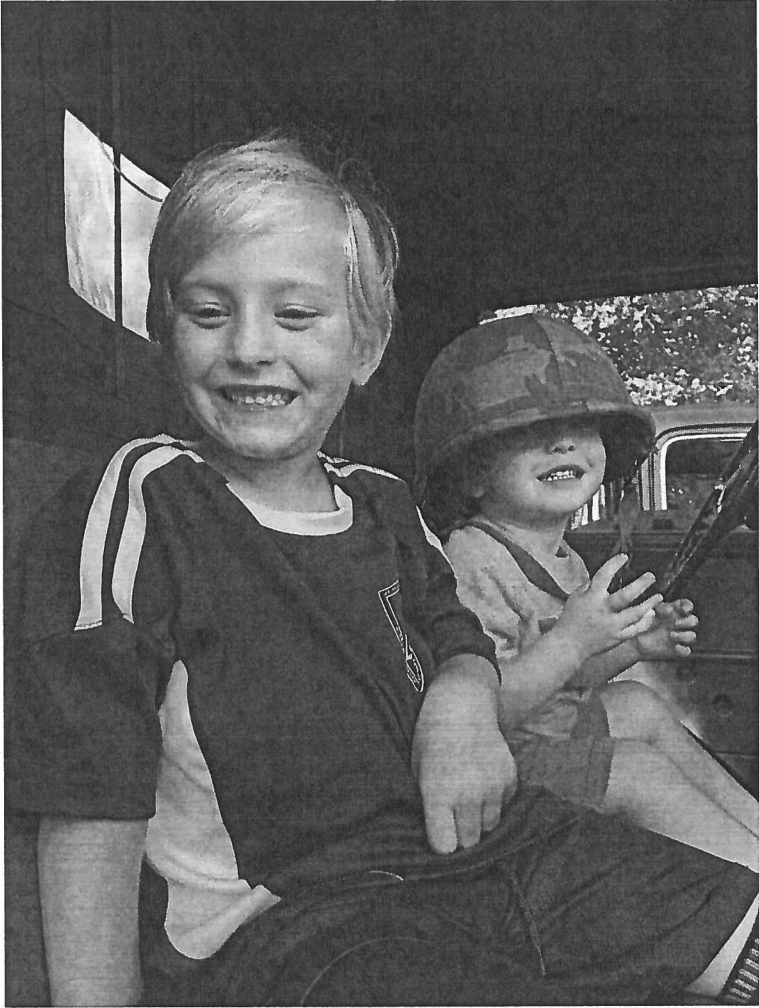

> Hello to all, and especially Pete Lucido who represents my district in St. Clair Shores.

> My name is RJ Hayden, retired SCS police officer. When I retired I was Lieutenant in charge of our traffic bureau, so I am maybe more aware of changes to our vehicle code. I would ask the committee to approve the request to change the law in regards to military vehicles. Please look at our current laws that allow licensing of classic or vintage motor vehicles and motorcycles. More than 25 years old, street use for parades-cruises-club meetings-test and tune, but not every day use.

> I currently own several motorcycles that our state classifies as historic and have authentic plates on them. One I also own is a 1942 Ford built Jeep of WW2. It has authentic plates on it, used for parades and car shows. Members of my local military vehicle club have large WW2 trucks, Korean and Vietnam era vehicles, some also very large. The current issue seems to be our state not approving military humv's for road use as well as a licensing category for historic MV's, which is why I am contacting you.

> As a former law enforcement officer with a traffic background I understand the problem of opening a new door and allowing certain vehicles to operate on our roads. Please understand that the people who buy these kind of vehicles, like me, do so to belong to a group of like minded people and display the old military vehicles for others to see as well as our enjoyment.

> Please look at the states around us that have recently changed their laws to allow these kind of vehicles. Adopt the parts you like, but please keep our laws similar to the current historic vehicle definitions for the police and public sake. Everyone understands them as is now, and creating a new category to add would be easy.
