

Career Awareness Elementary (K-5)

"Who am I" by answering this question students learn about themselves and become aware of six career pathways. During the early grades, students become familiar with careers through learning that connects classroom instruction to future work. Career awareness strategies show students various types of careers. At the elementary level, it is important that students' exposure includes CTE and Non-Traditional Careers.

Career Exploration & Investigation Middle School (6-8)

"Where am I Going" by answering this question students explore and investigate all 16 career clusters to discover which pathways and careers best align with their interests. Through embedded classroom lessons and activities, students start to develop an Educational Development Plan (EDP). The EDP include tools and course work that help students understand and appreciate their strengths and interests. Students start plans for their future with career information and postsecondary education data. Plans include course selection and career exploration and investigation of multiple pathways.

Career Preparation & Application High School (9-12)

"How am I going to get there" by answering this question students continue career exploration while focusing on career planning. Activities provide advanced experiences that offer real world, hands-on opportunities. Career planning strategies focus on making clear links between career options and educational decisions. Students take appropriate course work to prepare them for the next steps after high school. Students and their families need assistance with post-secondary planning that promote future life options.
